

Lanzarote – Canary Islands

Program for self guided walks

Introduction

Especially dedicated to more experienced walkers and those that wish to do the walks that we have chosen as the most beautiful and representative of the island. The walks can be done alone, with a partner, or with a group of friends or family.

You choose the dates and we will prepare the documents for a week of hiking in Lanzarote plus accommodation, car hire and necessary information such as information on restaurants, visits to tourist attractions, boat crossings, etc.

Each itinerary of our program is described in detail with the access, starting and finishing points, directions, gradients, estimated times, signs, geographical features, fauna and vegetation, necessary equipment, etc.

Along with the description, we will include a large scale map of the area and, based on your choice, we will include a fact sheet in which you will find useful facts and information.

What is necessary for a self-guided walk?

- to know how to follow a description, how to read a map, and how to use a compass.
- to concentrate on the signs of the path, landmarks or other reference points.
- to make decisions in adverse conditions: bad weather, tiredness, getting lost, etc.
- not to forget good equipment plus food, water, first-aid kit, etc.

Program

Day 1



Welcome at the airport. A meeting will be held to explain the program of the week. Hand out of documents (fact sheet, descriptions and maps), delivering of the keys of the accommodation and car hire. Depending on the flight schedule, a walk could be done in the north part of the island and/or a visit to the Cactus Garden and the Mirador del Río.



Day 2

Walk on the area of Volcan de la Corona and Famara's cliff. Visit to Cueva de Los Verdes.



Day 3

Walk through La Geria (vineyards on volcanic material). Visit to a wine cellar and to the Villa de Teguisse and César Manrique's foundation.



Day 4

Boat crossing to La Graciosa. Coastal walk on the island. Return to Lanzarote. Visit to Los Jameos del Agua.



Day 5

Walk on the surrounding areas of Timanfaya National Park. (craters, seas of lava, and fields of volcanic material). Visit to the National Park and the Visitors Center. Visit and bathing at Famara beach.



Day 6

El Golfo and its surroundings. Walk on the west coast. Swimming at the Papagayo beaches. Visit to the salt fields of Janubio.



Day 7

Fuerteventura. Crossing by ferry from Playa Blanca to Corralejo on the north of Fuerteventura. Visit to the "sacred mountain" of Tindaya, to Tefía Museum and Betancuria. Walk on Betancuria Massif. Swimming at the Dunes of Corralejo.

Return to Lanzarote.

Day 8

Car return at the airport and flight.

General Conditions

- 8 days, 7 nights, 6 days of excursion.
- Climate: mild all year. Swimming is possible in any season.
- Groups starting from 2 people.
- Grade: easy. Routes or paths of sand, stone and lava. Some open fields to cross. Maximum climb of 600 metres.
- Duration of walk: from 3 to 5 hours daily
- Accommodation: villas or apartments. Changes are not permitted during your stay.
- Getting around: on foot, in own car, and in boat or ferry.
- Equipment: walking boots or shoes, hat, sun protection cream, food and water.
- Prices*:
 - Two persons: 400€ per person
 - Group of 3 or more persons: 350€ per person
- Possibility of extending your stay.
- Possibility of making reservations at restaurants, visits to tourist attractions and domestic transportation.
- Dates: at the request of the interested party.

* The price includes airport reception, 7 nights' accommodation in a beachfront apartment or in a villa with a pool, car hire (group A for 1-4 people), documents, maps, and information about restaurants and domestic transportation (boat or ferry).

Not included in the base price: breakfast at your lodging, picnics during the excursions, dinners at different restaurants (Spanish and/or typical Canarian cuisine).

Flights to and from Lanzarote, drinks, visits to tourist centers and personal expenses are not included either.
